

On the map






- At the southeastern edge of the European Union

 - Emerged as a blend of different cultures, ethnicities and religions










Thessaloniki at a glance

 - Enforced business interaction with the upcoming Balkan states








Thessaloniki at a glance

A vibrant city

- Has always played a a significant role in the cultural life of Greece
 - § Cultural Capital of Europe (1997)
 - § International Film Festival of Thessaloniki
 - **§** Biennale of Contemporary Art
 - **§** State Museum of Contemporary Art (Costakis Collection)
 - **§** National Theatre of Northern Greece
- Hosting the biggest university of Greece thus a huge number of students and young people
- Advantaged by its physical location, Thessaloniki offers multiple entertainment and recreation options

 - § Rich nightlife






The Venue





- The Department of Physics is located in the main Aristotle University Campus, just at the edge of the historical city centre.
- It was established in 1928 and is now one of the oldest and biggest departments in Greece (in terms of students' number, personnel and research activity)
- I It has 5 sections:
 - **§** Solid State Physics
 - s Astrophysics, Astronomy & Mechanics
 - **§** Nuclear & Elementary Particles Physics
 - s Electronics & Computers
 - **§** Applied & Environmental Physics



Getting to Thessaloniki



- I Thessaloniki is located at the northern side of Greece, 504 km (310 miles) north of Athens.
 - By air: Thessaloniki International "Makedonia" Airport connects the city with major European cities, while there are frequent internal flights
 - By train: Thessaloniki is connected by train to Athens and other Balkan cities as well as Istanbul
 - By coach bus: Coach buses connect Thessaloniki with Athens and many other cities and towns throughout the territory
 - Public Transportation: Thessaloniki has a very good network of bus service, while the new metro of the city is currently under construction.









Accommodation Options



- I Thessaloniki has a wide range of hotels suitable for variable budgets, while maintaining high standards of accommodation and hospitality services
- I All hotels are located in the historical city centre, within walking distance from the conference venue
- Prices may vary depending on the hotel level and start approximately from 60 € (BB per night)

Thessaloniki offers a very interesting variety of archaeological and cultural sites


